Can you share a success story or a moment that stands out during your time at Habitat?


One of the moments that really stands out during my time at Habitat was relaunching the Habitat ReStore's Facebook page and ramping up our overall marketing efforts!

But what does it take to become a Habitat homeowner, and how does this process bring life-changing benefits to families and individuals in Frederick County?

The path to Habitat homeownership goes beyond just providing a home – it empowers future homeowners with the skills and stability they need for long-term success. Future homeowners must demonstrate a need for improved housing, the ability to repay an affordable mortgage, and a willingness to partner with Habitat.

Once selected, they engage in "sweat equity," contributing hours to help build their home, volunteering at the ReStore, and participating in other sweat equity opportunities. Habitat homeowners also attend workshops on homeownership and financial literacy to further support their success.
